1. WHAT CAN I DO IF I HAVE COVID19 SYMPTOMS?

If you have symptoms, please contact your GP by phone to find out whether you suspect you have Covid-19 disease. Alternatively, you can call the medical on-call service on 116 117.

2. INFORMATION FOR TRAVELLERS FROM THIRD COUNTRIES

Third-country nationals Family members of the so-called "nuclear family" (i.e. spouses, registered partners and under-age children or the parents of under-age children) of Germans, EU citizens or nationals of Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway, Switzerland or the United Kingdom or of third-country nationals with an existing right of residence in Germany may enter for temporary family visits. This applies irrespective of whether the third-country nationals' family members enter together with the reference person or alone.

Short-term entry of 1st and 2nd degree relatives of third-country nationals only for compelling family reasons.

Third-country nationals First and second degree relatives (e.g. children of full age, parents of full age children, siblings and grandparents), of Germans, EU citizens or nationals of Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway, Switzerland or Great Britain and third-country nationals with an existing right of residence in Germany may not, in principle, enter the country for merely temporary family visits.

More distant third-country nationals family members who are not first or second degree relatives may in principle not enter for family reasons alone.

1. INFORMATION FOR RETURNING TRAVELLERS

THERE IS A **TEST OBLIGATION** FOR THOSE ENTERING FROM RISK AREAS. AS LONG AS NO NEGATIVE TEST RESULT IS AVAILABLE, PEOPLE ENTERING THE COUNTRY FROM RISK AREAS HAVE TO GO INTO A 14-DAY QUARANTINE. Anyone entering Germany from a risk area must also fill out a so-called exit card before entering the country.

If you return to Mannheim from a risk area, you must report immediately to the City of Mannheim! Please send an email immediately after your return to 31corona@mannheim.de

[In the email, all persons of your family/household who entered the country must be listed: with names, with dates of birth, with date of entry, with flight number if applicable, from which country/countries you returned and where you stayed 14 days before entry.

The city of Mannheim needs your e-mail address, your home address (where the quarantine is being held) and, if possible, a telephone number, so that we can contact you quickly.]

2. WHERE AND HOW TO HAVE IT TESTED?

The regulation obliges people entering Germany from risk areas to have a corona test done when they enter Germany. Alternatively, those entering the country can present a negative test result, which must not be older than 48 hours.

The test must have been performed in a member state of the European Union or in another laboratory listed by the Robert Koch Institute at www.rki.de/covid-19-tests. The test certificate must be written in German or English.

CURRENTLY TRAVELERS FROM RISK AREAS ARE OFFERED FREE TESTS:

- Test centers with free tests at all airports.
- Test centers at some train stations (for example Stuttgart)
- Test centers at various rest stops along the freeways after border crossings.

- No free testing is guaranteed for travelers (no German citizens or persons residing in Germany) entering Germany. (Any costs incurred must be paid by the customer)
- The test center in the Mannheim Clinic is exclusively for people with symptoms.

Independent of any test carried out, you must in any case report to the local authority 31corona@mannheim.de when you re-enter the country from a risk area!
