## Sauna Festival “Sauna Coast”

February 14–15

Visitors will be able to enjoy 15 different saunas and 20 hot tubs. Bath masters will pamper guests with a variety of procedures and rituals designed to cleanse the body, heart, and mind. Guests will also have the opportunity to try ice baths and breathing practices.



## “TheATRIUM” Festival

May 19 – June 21

The festival consists of the Lithuanian Theatre Showcase, which presents the most outstanding works of Lithuanian theatres from recent years to international festival organizers, and the International Programme, featuring high-quality performances by talented theatre companies from abroad.



## Klaipėda Light Festival

February 19–21

This year’s theme invites reflection on the continuous changes in our lives—both internal and external. It encompasses the passage of time and its imprints on human experience, from the changing seasons to the stages of life, from childhood to maturity.



## Lithuanian Song and Dance Festival

June 7

This is an impressive celebration of children’s and youth choral singing, Lithuanian folk instrument orchestras, and dance ensembles, dedicated to preserving Lithuanian traditions.

## Klaipėda Music Spring Festival

April 4–25

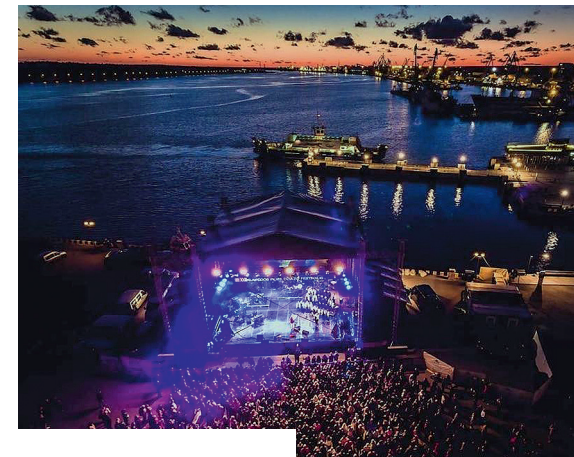
The oldest Lithuanian academic music festival, held since 1976. The impressive festival program features major orchestral genres, with top-level symphonic and chamber orchestras performing each year.



## Klaipėda Castle Jazz Festival

June 22–28

An international music event bringing together jazz, world music, and popular music enthusiasts from around the world. The festival program offers top-level concerts and educational activities.





## Midsummer Festival (St. John's Festival)

June 23

At the celebration, people named John are adorned with wreaths woven from herbs, while singing and dancing take place. Traditional craft workshops are held, and culinary heritage products are made.



## ORC Offshore Sailing European Championship

August 7–15

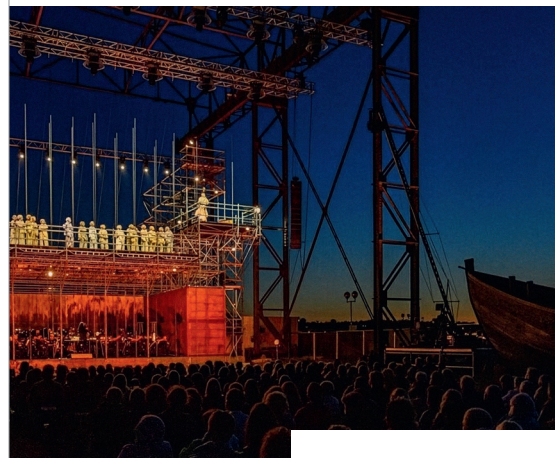
Sailors from over 10 different countries will take part in the competition. Visitors will be able to enjoy the impressive event from the shores of the Curonian Lagoon.



## International Intangible Cultural Heritage Festival “Lauksnos”

July 9–12

This international intangible cultural heritage festival showcases UNESCO-protected elements of traditional culture, including the oral and musical traditions of different peoples and masterpieces of folk art.



## Festival of Klaipėda

August 7–15

It is a classical music and opera festival, whose main event takes place outdoors in a very unique location – the old shipyard hall.

## Sea Festival

July 24–26

Since 1934, the festival held in the city has been the largest summer fiesta, attracting around half a million visitors from both Lithuania and abroad. During the celebration, more than 100 events of various kinds take place – including ceremonies, parades, exhibitions, concerts, street festivals, fairs, and more.



## International Orchestra Festival

September 4–5

An international music festival inviting audiences to immerse themselves in a whirlwind of orchestral sound. Performances by wind ensembles will take place in various open-air spaces across Klaipėda.

**October 17**

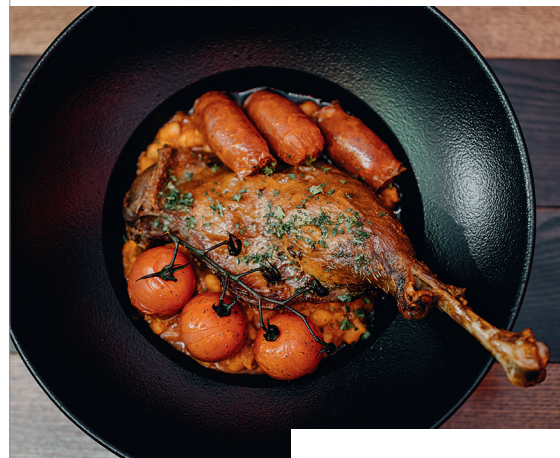
