


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LIFE SQUARED

It was through a fateful and eventful history that the “secret capital of the Electoral Palatinate” developed its current qualities as an urbane, open and tolerant trade and service center.

Since Elector Friedrich IV of the Palatinate elevated Mannheim to city status in 1607 and laid the foundation stone for the construction of the Friedrichsburg fortress, the city has had to be rebuilt a total of four times

following destruction. Something that has always been retained, however, is the unique grid-like road network of the city center. While streets in other cities bear the names of famous people, those in Mannheim are made up of letters and numbers.

The Rathaus is on “E5”, while the Stadthaus is on “N1”. Hence, Mannheim is known by many simply as “the City of the Squares”.



INNOVATION AND PIONEERS IN MANNHEIM

Situated at the confluence of the Rhine and Neckar rivers, Mannheim was first established as a proud fortress city. However, the city earned renown as the residence of the electors of the palatinate in the 18th century. The “Mannheim school” founded by Johann Stamitz wrote musical history and Mozart even strove to become a member of the orchestra. Perhaps this laid the foundation stone for the city to be named “UNESCO City of Music” in 2014.

On 13 January 1782, Friedrich Schiller presented the first performance of “die Räuber” (The Robbers) at the newly completed National Theatre. In the 19th century, the city emerged as a cradle of democracy and the center of the 1848/49 revolution.

As a flourishing metropolis for trade, industry and science, Mannheim has attracted pioneers and inventors to this day. Karl von Drais built the first two-wheeled vehicle, the precursor to the bicycle, here. Carl Benz

built the first petrol-powered car and Fritz Huber invented the first tractor to run on crude oil, the Lanz-Bulldog. Even the fuses in your fuse box were developed in Mannheim. This living and breathing city has much to offer. A city where tradition meets innovation. Today, the electoral palace is home to one of the best universities in Germany, while numerous start-up hubs and the creative scene bring new ideas and developments to the market. Made in Mannheim for the world.

MANNHEIM IS INSPIRING


Mannheim is a city with an amazingly rich cultural scene. On the eastern outskirts of the town is the TECHNOSEUM, where visitors can delve into the fascinating world of technology. The neighbouring Planetarium transports visitors of all ages to distant galaxies. Continue on into the town centre and you will reach the “Wasserturm” (water tower) and the “Kunsthalle” (art gallery), reopening in december in a brand new building. Just a stone’s throw away, Archangel Michael greets you from the spire of Christuskirche church. The “Nationaltheater Mannheim” works its magic on the ring road that encircles Mannheim city centre. Exploring the “squares”, the original grid, is also a rewarding cultural experience. The “Reiss-Engelhorn-Museen” in the heart of the city are in the same historic district as the “Barockschloss Mannheim”. Look out over the rooftops of the city centre from the large inner courtyard of what was once the elector’s residence, and admire the dome of one of the city’s most beautiful churches, the “Jesuitenkirche”.

Guided tours

We have put together a fascinating guided tour all about the bicycle: “200 Jahre Fahrrad – eine weltbewegende Erfindung” (“200 years of the bicycle – an invention that changed the world”). More information is available in the “Mannheim erkunden” brochure.

Monnem Bike: where it all started.

Karl Freiherr von Drais invented the bicycle in Mannheim 200 years ago. He rode his invention for the first time on 12 June 1817, along what was then the best road in the area. The maiden journey of the “Draisine” took him from Mannheim to the summer residence of the elector, “Schwetzinger Relaishaus”.


The forerunner of the modern bicycle had no pedals – the rider had to push himself along with his feet and the frame, handlebars and wheels of the first model were made of wood. The “velocipede” soon became a success in other countries. In England, for example, it was called the “pedestrian hobby horse”.

The inventor had his original idea in 1816-1817, when failed harvests had led to famine and the oat prices had soared. Horses to draw a vehicle suddenly became a luxury. This set Drais working on what became the Draisine, which in turn was the basis for today’s modern bicycle. With the slogan “Monnem Bike – wo alles begann”, Mannheim will be celebrating the anniversary in 2017 with fascinating exhibitions and spectacular events all about the bicycle. A major regional exhibition at the TECHNOSEUM, “2 Räder – 200 Jahre. Freiherr von Drais und die Geschichte des Fahrrades” (“Two

wheels – 200 years. Baron von Drais and the history of the bicycle”) raises the curtain on a rich and colourful birthday party for the bicycle in the heart of the city. A highlight in Mannheim’s cultural calendar, to which all visitors are warmly invited.

1 TECHNOSEUM

What could be more exciting than technology?

Get involved, experiment and experience. Visitors to the TECHNOSEUM can try out experiments for themselves and learn about science and technology in fun and exciting ways at around 110 different installations. Nowhere else in Germany can you see the history of technology presented so effectively: the experiments are an integral part of the permanent exhibition on the history of industrialisation. Visitors see experiments in their historical context and learn how discoveries have developed and been used. With the help of "live exhibits", you can travel back through 200 years of engineering, technological and industrial history and discover a world where paper was produced by hand and textiles made on mechanical looms.

2 Räder – 200 Jahre

It is also 200 years since the world's first cycle trip: when Baron Drais rode his invention, the velocipede, for the first time in 1817, this signalled the advent of individual mobility. To mark the anniversary of this maiden journey, the museum is running the exhibition "2 Räder – 200 Jahre. Freiherr von Drais und die Geschichte des Fahrrades" until 25 June 2017. Nearly 100 bicycles from the historical velocipede to the modern single-speed bike document not just



the various stages of the bicycle's technical development, but also how the bicycle has influenced and continues to influence society.

Decisions in the supermarket of choices

Anyone who decides to visit the TECHNOSEUM from November 2017 on will be faced with more choices on their arrival: the interactive exhibition "Entscheiden" ("Decisions") takes visitors into a supermarket of choices. In their exploration of a world in which everything seems possible but little is certain, visitors must deal with choices from different areas of life with which we are all familiar: what profession should I choose? Who is the right person for me?



2 Planetarium Mannheim

A trip to the moon? A wander along the Milky Way? No problem! Visitors discover the fascinating world of the stars, planets and galaxies and gaze up into the heavens as only seen from pitch black locations on earth or from space. The Universarium star projector and FullDome technology under a 20 m dome transform astronomy into a 360° adventure and bring cosmic travel and fascinating science to life.

It was in Mannheim that the world's first planetarium opened back in 1927. The original planetarium was only in operation for 16 years, as the dome was badly damaged in an air raid in 1943 and was not repaired but instead completely demolished ten years later. The current planetarium was finally built not far from the original site in Europaplatz in Wilhelm-Varnholt-Allee, and officially opened in December 1984. As well as traditional astronomy events, the Planetarium also stages musical shows and lectures, special programmes of events for children and school classes, and a range of English-language events. Highlights in 2017 will include the return of the highly successful Space Jazz Nights featuring Claus Boesser-Ferrari

and Joss Turnbull, Lektron and the Thomas Siffing Groove Jazz Quartet. The programme will once again include the series of radio plays run in partnership with SWR2 radio. This will include "Venezianische Scharade" based on the novel by Donna Leon, and "Der talentierte Mr. Ripley" adapted from the novel by Patricia Highsmith ("The Talented Mr Ripley").

3 Kunsthalle Mannheim

The “Kunsthalle Mannheim” will reach one of the most important milestones in its 100-year history with the opening of its spectacular new building in December. Adjoining the historical art nouveau building, the extension is creating a unique “city in the city” for art in the heart of Mannheim. The new build was designed by the global firm of architects Gerkan, Marg und Partner gmp.

In Mannheim’s most beautiful square and just beside the world-famous grid and its bustling pedestrian precinct, the new “Kunsthalle” will be the perfect place for all those seeking inspiration and food for the mind.

The centrepiece of the new “Kunsthalle” remains its internationally famous collection, which will be exhibited in new surroundings when the gallery reopens. The collection includes 2000 paintings, 850 sculptures, 34,000 works on paper and 800 objects of applied art. With masterpieces from Édouard Manet to Francis Bacon and William Kentridge and an exceptional range of sculptures, “Kunsthalle Mannheim” is rightly considered a leading light in the German museum scene.

Open day “**Architektur pur**” (“Pure architecture”) on Saturday 14 and Sunday 15 July 2017: art and culture lovers will have a unique opportunity to view the completed new building and explore the “city in the city”. Go exploring from the spacious atrium filled with natural light and surrounded by seven free-standing “exhibition houses”, up stairways and over bridges, past the window on the city with views of the “Wasserturm” (water tower), along terraces of sculptures and the exhibition houses’ connecting balconies to the roof garden that looks out over Mannheim.

4 Nationaltheater Mannheim

Nationaltheater Mannheim (NTM) is one of the largest and oldest municipal repertory companies in Germany, and represents both tradition and modernity. The works of Schiller and links to Mozart continue to shape the work of NTM today. Countless premieres and German premieres in opera, theatre, dance and youth theatre, plus the “Mannheimer Bürgerbühne” local participation theatre launched in 2012, are testimony to the innovative, modern continuation of the theatre’s long and proud tradition. Excellent creative output makes NTM one of Mannheim’s flagship cultural centres and a leading theatre at a national level. This is reflected in numerous awards; most recently in 2015 when the NTM opera was named the “Opera house of the year” by the opera magazine “Opernwelt”.

19th Internationale Schillertage 2017

“Die schöne Freiheit ... will ich verpflanzen in mein Vaterland” (“I want to plant the freedom [I have found here] in my native land”). These words come from Friedrich Schiller’s drama “Demetrius”. For Schiller, a leading figure in the Enlightenment, freedom meant using your head and seeing your own questions as a challenge to find responses instead of simply repeating what others thought. The theatre’s response must be and is to tell complex stories and


present people with all their contradictions, just as Friedrich Schiller does in his classic dramas “Maria Stuart”, “Wilhelm Tell” and “Die Räuber”. The 19th Internationale Schillertage festival will be addressing this challenge in a host of visiting productions by renowned theatre groups from Germany and abroad, and new productions by the Croatian director Oliver Frlić and the Danish performance collective SIGNA.

5 Reiss-Engelhorn-Museen Mannheim

Experience culture

Anyone looking for great cultural highlights in Mannheim must visit the “Reiss-Engelhorn-Museen” (rem), the largest complex of municipal museums in southern Germany. The four museums form a vibrant museum quarter around Toulonplatz square in the heart of the city. A wide range of collections and special exhibitions give visitors of all ages a fascinating insight into fields from the dawn of humanity to the present day. With a great range of events including concerts, lectures, workshops, readings and major events on specific exhibitions, the “rem” are a national cultural hotspot.

2017 exhibition highlight: “Die Päpste und die Einheit der lateinischen Welt” / 21 May – 31 October 2017

2017 will see the start of celebrations of the 500th anniversary of the Reformation. The “Reiss-Engelhorn-Museen” will be marking the occasion by exploring the history of the papacy. Precious manuscripts, important documents, wonderful paintings and magnificent

vestments from the unique collections of the Vatican and other leading museums and collectors will introduce visitors to fascinating aspects of the papacy from antiquity to the Renaissance. The popes held both spiritual and secular authority that shaped not just theological development, but also the development of western civilisation.

Was the first pocketknife really made of stone? Who invented the car? When were the first jeans worn? And do moon boots actually come from the moon? Attention all hungry minds! All young visitors are – of course – allowed to touch the exhibits and try out their very own inventions.

6 Barockschloss Mannheim

Come. Marvel. Enjoy.

The “Barockschloss Mannheim” was one of the most important cultural centers in Germany more than 250 years ago. The former royal residence of the Electoral Palatinate and Baden between the Rhine and Neckar rivers is steeped in history. Following almost complete destruction in the Second World War, the central block was re-built, restoring the magnificent ceremonial staircase and prestigious Rittersaal hall. The restored bel étage staterooms allow visitors to re-live the once royal splendor.

Today, the baroque winter residence of the electors of the palatinate is central to life in the city of Mannheim and remains as much a dominant and definitive force in the city as it was 300 years ago. The dimensions alone bear testimony to this, with the façade facing the city measuring some 400 meters. The vast courtyard is sufficiently large to provide a grand stage for spectacular major events to this day.

Visitors can wander up the giant staircase to the sumptuous first floor with its staterooms, entering the Rittersaal and imagining the magnificent feasts that were once celebrated there. The bel étage display rooms offer a lasting insight into the electoral era. A convenient murder? The gossip of ladies-in-waiting? Or ... I love

you alone? Children and adults alike can experience an entertaining and fascinating tour through a multi-faceted history that captures the essence of centuries gone by. Visitors can even enjoy a dance in costumes like those worn by the princes and princesses of the court. However, for those visitors who are simply inquisitive to learn, the carefully preserved original exhibits presented in the display rooms and the expertly refurbished museum collection on the ground floor offer numerous highlights.

What would Mannheim’s once famous “Court of the Muses” be without music and theater? Numerous concert events in the Rittersaal bear testimony to the widely renowned cultural bloom. Simply look around and allow yourself to be inspired and transported into another world.

7 Jesuitenkirche

The “Jesuitenkirche”, a magnificent “exclamation mark from God” in eyeshot of Mannheim Baroque Palace, a resplendent former court church, a Baroque architectural gem and a living place of prayer. To this day, the church holds a Eucharistic mass at 18:00 and enjoys a special position in the Catholic Church in the region. Built between 1738 and 1760, the parish church is also the domicile of the dean of the catholic municipal deanery of Mannheim. This person is also normally the priest.

The “Jesuitenkirche” is consecrated to Saint Ignatius of Loyola and Francis Xavier. It owes its construction to Carl Philipp, Elector of the Palatinate (1716 – 1742), who personally laid the foundation stone in 1733. Following his death, the court church was completed under Elector Carl Theodor (1742 – 1799) some 25 years later. Numerous architects and artists were involved in the construction of the church. Alessandro Galli da Bibiena, Franz Wilhelm Rabaliatti, Guillaume d’Hauberat and Nicolas de Pigage were responsible for the designing the house of God. Paul Egell and Peter Anton von Verschaffelt were among those to set the defining tones of the interior decoration.

8 Christuskirche

The conspicuous figure of Archangel Michael welcomes visitors to the “Christuskirche” from the spire of the church in the Werderplatz. The imposing church is just 5 minutes’ walk from the Friedrichsplatz with its Wasserturm, Kunsthalle and Rosengarten. Designed as a “Protestant Cathedral” with 1,200 seats, it is the largest Protestant church in the city. The church was built between 1907 and 1911 based upon the plans of Theophil Frey and Christian Schrade.

The tower-shaped domed church connects the Art Nouveau style with Neo-Baroque forms. The curved Baroque floor plan is based upon a square inscribed with a Greek cross. The dome housing 5 bells made by company “Bachert” in Karlsruhe produces the deepest and, according to many, the most replete peal in Mannheim. The dome is surrounded by larger-than-life figures of the 12 apostles. The imposing pediment above the main entrance features a high relief by sculptor Ludwig Habich based upon the words of Jesus “Come unto me, all ye tha labor and are heavy laden”.

In the interior, the eyes are immediately drawn to the striking crucifixion group by Johannes Hoffart. The dome above the crossing has a clear span width of 23 m. In the central axis is the pulpit, with the altar in front and the organ on the gallery to the rear. The 4-manual instrument built by Steinmeyer, with 96 registers and a remote console, is the largest historical organ in Baden-Württemberg and was described by composer Sigfried Karg-Elert as a “miracle of Mannheim”.

9 Main cemetery and Jewish cemetery

Lime trees and horse chestnut trees line the main path and grave-stones from various periods in history nestle against a green landscape. Mannheim's main cemetery invites visitors to immerse themselves in history as well as to pause and reflect. Situated in the heart of the city, the historic location has much to tell about the people and periods of the city. The main cemetery is the largest of ten in Mannheim and is situated in the district of Wohlgelegen. The Jewish cemetery, created at the same time, is immediately adjacent.

The old cemeteries of Mannheim, of different denominations, were all situated within the former city fortifications. In 1839, the city planned a large, central cemetery and asked the Jewish community whether they would like to acquire a site together with the Christian communities. The city rabbis agreed to a facility separated by a wall. Both cemeteries opened in 1842. After numerous extensions, the main cemetery currently measures around 35 hectares. The oldest part of the cemetery is accessed via the central hall of the arcade structure on Röntgenstraße, which comprises the entire old cemetery area of 125 meters in width. The hall includes wing structures on both sides, each featuring arcades with 13 arches and completed with a corner pavilion. Today, the halls are used for urn burials.

The Jewish cemetery

The entrance area to the Jewish cemetery features uniform grave-stones in red sandstone. The design changed from around 1870. The materials became more varied and the styles more diverse. The upper middle classes placed resplendent gravestones around the walls of the cemetery. Numerous figures were buried here whose works contributed significantly to the development of the city. Those resting in the cemetery, among other pioneers, include Julius Aberle, whose will enabled the original construction of the Kunst-halle, Bernhard Herschel, benefactor of the impressive Herschelbad swimming baths in the city center, and co-founder of BASF Seligmann Ladenburg. Please observe the opening hours.

Garten der Geschichte

A former graveyard in the main cemetery was recently converted into a memorial ground. The "Garten der Geschichte" (Garden of History) remembers those people of Mannheim who made an outstanding contribution to the city.

The City of Squares has a surprisingly rich flora and fauna. With 1800 hours of sunshine a year and large conservation areas, Mannheim offers its visitors a wealth of ways to enjoy the out of doors. This very symbiosis of city style and natural beauty is what makes Mannheim so special. The two rivers, the Rhine and the Neckar, create a unique flair and a rich green space in the heart of the city. Along the banks of the Neckar are paths and cycle routes, lush greenery, and lawns for relaxing and sunbathing. The "Reißinsel" on the Rhine is Mannheim's oldest conservation area and is maintained in its original beauty. Enchanted spots on the river bank are the perfect places for spending a quiet afternoon. The rivers and large city parks, charming green spaces and long tree-lined avenues are Mannheim's green lung.

Relax. Discover the unexpected. Find peace. Play sport. Roam through unspoilt nature protection areas. Visitors to Mannheim are surprised by the diversity of its natural areas.



10 Nature and landscape protection area on the banks of the Neckar

The Neckar river is bordered by meadows and pathways that allow visitors to discover a unique landscape. The circular trail along the banks of the Neckar is particularly suited to walks and bike rides on mild summer days either for those who wish to stay within the city limits or those prepared to venture slightly further afield. Local destinations such as Seckenheim Castle, the Jewish cemetery or the Maulbeereninsel (Mulberry Island) can be reached via a journey through the attractive landscapes along the river.



11 Waldpark and Reißinsel

The Waldpark (Forest Park) extends directly along the Rhine adjacent to the Neckarau district. In the 19th century, Grand Duchess Stephanie von Baden, who gave her name to the promenade, acquired the entire area and transformed it into an English-style landscape park. Today, visitors can enjoy meadowy landscapes, watercourses and a diverse tree population. The park flows into the "Reißinsel", one of the largest floodplains on the Upper Rhine. Together, these areas provide an environment for a plethora of domestic flora and fauna, which visitors can discover and observe. The "Reißinsel" is closed to the public each year from 01 March to 30 June for conservation reasons.





12 The Luisenpark – the green heart of Mannheim

Created between 1892 and 1903 by the Siesmayer brothers from Frankfurt and named after Grand Duchess Luise von Baden, the Luisenpark rapidly became one of the most popular green spaces in Mannheim. The park received a number of new extensions and arrangements for the German National Garden Festival in 1975 based upon plans from award-winning landscape architects, which enhanced its appearance to such an extent that the Luisenpark remains one of the most attractive parks in Europe.

Around 1.2 million visitors each year enjoy the spectacular interplay of more than 120 tree species and more than 100 types of shrub as well as 300,000 spring flowers and hundreds of thousands of summer and autumn bloomers. These visitors can bathe in seas of flowers, discover the park's fauna, experience culture, celebrate festivals or simply enjoy the tranquility. As well as enjoying the domestic and exotic fauna, visitors to the park can immerse themselves in a vibrant and fascinating park landscape 365 days a year that has much more to offer besides its unadulterated recreational value.

In addition to a range of children's play facilities, from the mud and water playground to the adventure and castle playground, the glasshouse with aquarium, terrarium, butterfly paradise, tree fern

and cactus house provide further areas for exploration. Younger park visitors particularly enjoy the "jungle expedition" in the heated tropical house. The Chinese garden, with its faithfully designed largest Chinese teahouse in Europe, brings the Far East to Mannheim. Whether a romantic gondoletta trip, cultural events from the lake stage, celebrating at one of the major park festivals in the summer, lazing on one of the spacious sunbathing lawns, or relaxing in the unique sound oasis and listening to spherical sounds in a natural setting, the Luisenpark offers the complete open-air experience.

13 The Herzogenriedpark – original natural landscapes

Situated on the periphery of Mannheim's Neckarstadt district, the Herzogenriedpark offers a secluded spot for everyone over a total of 21 hectares.

Whether the romantic cottage garden, the enchanted rose garden in which 100,000 roses virtually explode every summer, or the many shady, tree-lined walkways, beneath mighty treetops, visitors can experience the true meaning of "slowing down". The sun terraces offer fantastic views of the mounds of flowers. A park lake, Kneipp basin and numerous fountains offer cool refreshment on hot days and the perfect ingredients for relaxation and recreation among nature. When it comes to movement, the sports park in Neckarstadt is ideal. From boules to basketball, table tennis, tennis, athletics with a cinder track and long jump as well as a "keep fit circuit" comprising 20 pieces of fitness equipment in the open air, the park offers everything the recreational athlete could wish for.

Younger park visitors will particularly enjoy the walking back course, the new slackline facility and the large trampoline with its six sprung areas, the rope course where climbing-mad children can clamber up

11-metre ropes, the spray guns and the mysterious cave labyrinth. And, of course, they will love the mini-zoo with petting enclosure, which is home to rabbits and Guinea pigs, sheep, racka with their spiral-shaped horns, Valais Blackneck goats, dwarf goats, Braunes Bergschaf sheep, donkeys and woolly pigs.

For all park lovers in Mannheim's Neckarstadt, two three-day events, namely the medieval fête and Electoral Palatinate craftsmen's and farmers' markets, are equally popular.
